to use extracts from an article on Tamworth Aerodrome. The story of The Sydney Morning Herald's Flying Service was assisted immeasurably by John Laming's major contribution, in addition to Lloyd Maundrell's story reproduced courtesy of Ron Cuskelly. Lastly there's Adastra. Good background to the Adastra story was found in an early history written by John McCarthy, which appeared in The Globe; Journal of the Australian Map Circle, but it was contact with Mike Wood, a former RAAF navigator with extensive time on Mosquitoes and later Adastra's Operations Manager, which was to change how I saw Adastra's history. Mike provided much information from his own records, including copies of the Adastra in-house newsletter Australian Aerial Survey Review, and put me in touch with other former employees and supported the project right from my first contact with him. Other special thanks for their important contributions to my coverage of Adastra's Hudsons go to Wally Bowles, Ron Cuskelly, Ted McKenzie, Kevin Paylich and Peter Shute. For readers who want to know more about the life and times of Adastra, its people and aircraft, I refer them to Ron Cuskelly's superb website www.adastra.adastron.com.
